MAIN TEXT: Luke 24:13-35

OBSERVATION: *What is this text saying?*

1. Who were these two men walking to Emmaus?
2. What was the general disposition of these men up to the time Jesus revealed Himself to them?
3. What was Jesus' response to their disbelief?
4. What are the disciples' responses once they discover who their new companion is?

INTERPRETATION: *What does this text mean?*

1. In this passage there are two disciples whom had been with Jesus. Now they doubt the women whom had reported that Jesus had risen and are questioning if He really was the messiah. Why are they so discouraged and questioning who Jesus is?
2. Jesus brought the disciples to the Old Testament to show them that what He taught and went through was part of God's plan for salvation all along. Look at Genesis 12:1-3, Numbers 21:9 with John 3:14-15 and Isaiah 53:1-6. How do these verses relate to Jesus?
3. The story of Jesus' resurrection is something that most of us have heard many times and we can start to lose the importance of the event. Why is it important that Jesus was resurrected?

APPLICATION: *How should we now live?*

1. How should the fact of the resurrection affect the way we live?
2. What can we do to make Easter more of a worshipful experience and less of a consumerist holiday?
