## **QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Have someone in the group summarize the main point/sub points that were preached from Sunday's text. Were there any big things that the Lord revealed to you as you listened and reflected?
- 2. **SUBMIT TO THE WORD** In verse 16 Paul writes to Timothy telling him that the Church needs to protect the truth of "the mystery of godliness" or the Gospel message of Christ. How does Fathom's dedication to expository preaching (preaching through the text verse by verse) protect the Gospel? How can we as individual Church members help protect the Gospel in our daily lives?
- 3. **RESPOND IN WORSHIP** Despite the great temptation and tendency to feel unworthy of God and His love, how can you remind yourself and other believers that they are welcome to come home and that God loves us despite what we think might prevent him from loving us?
- 4. **LIVE IN COMMUNITY** Why is it important for a believer to become part of the church and not just attend church? When you have committed yourself to being a part of the community at church how has your experience in that community changed?
- 5. **JOIN ON MISSION** Chris' final point was that everyone should come home, whether that was at Fathom or their own home church. How can we as a church ensure that new people feel welcome and at home at Fathom?
